

## British Values & Prevent Duty Policy and procedure.

As a setting it is our duty to ensure that British Values are promoted within the setting. Through our Early Years setting we ensure that children's individuality, faiths and beliefs are celebrated. As an early years setting it is our duty to ensure that faiths and beliefs are not enhanced by radicalization. The prevent duty guidance helps us to reduce the threat to the UK from terrorism by supporting people from becoming terrorists or supporting terrorism.

If we as a setting suspect that the any child's parent or carers may be draw towards terrorism then an action plan will need to be put in to place, and the respective people contacted to help.

Here are some examples of how British Values are embedded in our day-to-day curriculum:

- We teach children to be kind, helpful and respectful of others;
- We teach children to be part of their local community;
- We plan to celebrate festivals and mark special days from the world around us;

We teach the children that working together as a team helps us to achieve more, even if one person believes in something different we can still play together.

As part of their job description staff members are to implement this in nursery play. Any member who isn't embedding this good practice, will be re-trained in the area with an action plan put in place. If this continues, the person in question will receive disciplinary action.
